The History of Federal Hill

Federal Hill park not only includes a stairway to a view of the city, but it has a deep history in Baltimore. It is one of the oldest neighborhoods in Baltimore. During the 18th century, Federal Hill was at the height of industrial growth and home to hundreds to thousands of immigrants. Fed was known as a historic hub for ship building. You can find a shipyard just down the street of Warren Avenue. You will also recognize the cannons at the top of the hill. These cannons are pointed towards the Inner Harbor and represent a piece of the Civil War. In 1880, the city purchased the land and designated it as Federal Hill.

Another great piece of Fed Hill is the park. The hill itself overlooks the Harbor of Baltimore. At the beginning of the semester when I first discovered Fed Hill, the warm weather was perfect for volleyball across from the Maryland Science Center or going for a run with my suitemate throughout the harbor. Sometimes my roommates and I would go to the Rusty Scupper for a high end dinner. If running isn't your thing, a long walk around the Hill to get to the top of the park encompasses the vibrance of Baltimore.
